

Generations of Learning

The Ashford Place, Heritage Lottery funded **Generations of Learning** project is working with Elders from the Irish and Pakistani communities to record and share their experiences of migrating to Cricklewood and surrounding areas in the 1950s and 1960s.

The project includes recording oral history interviews, creating a short film, developing an exhibition, and presenting community events such as story-telling and public talks. It will run from November 2017 to October 2018.

Volunteer Photographer / Photo Editor

Ashford Place will be recording interviews with Elders from the Irish and Pakistani communities, to capture their memories of coming to London and building a life in a new country. The interviews, donated material, and new research will be used to develop a public exhibition and a programme of public events will allow local communities to learn about and celebrate the migrant stories.

Following training, the Volunteer Photographer / Photo Editor will edit photos ready to be used in the exhibition or on the project website, using specialist photo editing software and uploading material to websites. The work will involve attending public events organised by the project and taking photos to record them and the people taking part. This will include completing permission forms from people being photographed. The photos will form part of the final archive to be deposited with Brent Archives at the end of the project. They will also be used in the final project report. We welcome applications from people with disabilities or impairments and will be happy to discuss what suitable adjustments might be made to the role.

On a day-to-day basis, the Volunteer Photographer / Photo Editor will work independently, working alongside other project team members at events.

The volunteer will be supported by the Project Lead to identify training needs, with regular meetings to ensure progress. Training and extra expenses, such as transporting equipment, will be paid for by the project. Daily expenses will be paid via BACS.

The Volunteer Photographer / Photo Editor role will include about 20 days between April - August 2018. There will be some flexibility on the days worked, in agreement with the Project Lead. Training will be organised for December 2017.
